Supporting Student Success



This past May, one of our case managed students, Carlos, at Apollo Middle School was wrapping up his 8th grade year when he started hanging with the wrong crowd and was expelled for having drugs at school. With his middle school experience abruptly coming to an end, Carlos fell behind.

In August, our CIS Site Coordinator, Allison, was attending an Apollo family engagement event where she ran into Carlos. They caught up on what he had been up to during the summer, and he shared that he wanted to get a fresh start this school year but because of a language barrier he was confused and unsure of where to report to school the following week. Allison helped him get enrolled in the correct school and connected him with other resources he needed to start the year off right. They also talked about what led him to getting expelled the previous school year, which he felt was his boredom after soccer ended. To address this, together they talked with the middle school soccer coach and Carlos is helping out with the team as an assistant coach, in addition to playing for the high school.

The relationship Carlos and Allison developed when he was in middle school proved that she was someone he trusted, and he knew he could turn to when he needed help. Allison shared that Carlos' year is off to a great start and he has perfect attendance. He is also able to keep in touch with Allison by popping by her office before he hits the field to coach the middle school team!
