- Is struggling with depression or other mental health issues, our coordinator will provide counseling and connect the student to a mental health professional if needed.
- These are just a few instances, and you'll find more in this newsletter. I feel fortunate to work with such a smart, committed team on our shared passion of

making sure all students have the resources they need to be successful. I also appreciate the passion and talents of our school and community partners. It takes all





As a classroom teacher, Anna was in the first group of freshmen that Kristin taught. Anna was quiet, shy and always smiling. "I had 200 kids that year, but Anna was

special," said Kristin. Two weeks into the school year, Anna began missing class and by Christmas was absent two to three days a week. She loved school and friends, but kept getting sick and missing. Kristin offered academic support and make up work,



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




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
